What is Edmodo?

Edmodo is a secure, social learning platform for teachers and students. It provides a safe and easy way for classes to connect and collaborate, share content and access homework, grades and school notices. Their goal is to help teachers harness the power of social media to customize the classroom for each and every learner.

How Do I Make Changes?

Your PROFILE page keeps track of the number of students in groups you have created or co-teach, the number of teachers you are connected with, and the number of items added directly to your library.

From your SETTINGS page, you can sign up to receive notifications, control your privacy options, and manage your profile information.

What Am I supposed to do with Edmodo?

Edmodo can be many different things:

- an extension of your classroom
- a staff development tool
- a means of communicating with parents
- a connection to teachers across the globe

<p>Outside of Class Discussions</p> <p>Uses: extend class discussions, exchange comments, critiques and questions about content or assignments</p> <p>Benefits: community building, continuity between class sessions</p>	<p>In-class Back Channel</p> <p>Uses: Classroom discussion, real-time commenting on lesson, archiving all viewpoints and possible answers</p> <p>Benefits: engages less vocal students, archives comments and learning</p>	<p>In-class Directed Assignments and Discussion</p> <p>Uses: Open or guided questions and assignments with student responses and turn ins</p> <p>Benefits: accountability, engages all students, organized Gradebook</p>
<p>Small Group Projects</p> <p>Uses: Collaborative projects with small teams of students, discussion, sharing Google Docs</p> <p>Benefits: Communication only with team members, quick responses</p>	<p>Collaborative Note-Taking</p> <p>Uses: Students taking notes together on classroom content, screencasting, commenting and responses to in-class notes</p> <p>Benefits: Companion guide to all curriculum, Shared knowledge</p>	<p>Comprehension Check Polls</p> <p>Uses: Quick checks for understanding with only a few given options</p> <p>Benefits: Allows for reflection in replies, visual representation of knowledge</p>
<p>Backpack Storage</p> <p>Uses: Uploading files, links and resources for classroom and personal use</p> <p>Benefits: Cloud-based storage, unlimited uploads</p>	<p>Embedded Projects</p> <p>Uses: Glogster, Schooltube, Pixton, Voicethread, and other interactive assignments</p> <p>Benefits: All projects embedded into one place, higher engagement than "file-based" projects</p>	<p>Group Folders</p> <p>Uses: Storing just-in-time resources, attaching important how-to videos</p> <p>Benefits: Organized resources, no re-sharing required when adding files</p>

Managing Groups

Creating Groups

Groups provide an environment for students to communicate and collaborate. In groups, you have the ability to name your group and provide the details of your group (grade and subject area).

Edmodo will generate a unique 6-digit code for your group. This code will allow students to join your newly created group.

Sharing Codes

A new feature in Edmodo allows you to invite people to your group. By using the “Request To Join URL” feature, you can have Edmodo create a link for you to share.

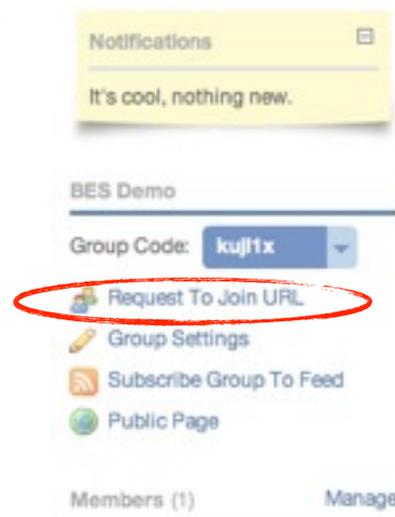
As the group’s creator, you approve or deny requests to join your group.

Organizing Content

Your LIBRARY allows you to store, manage, and share your files with group members and connected teachers. Your library has unlimited storage space, however, each piece of content added must be under 100MB.

To help stay organized, you can place your library content into folders. You can name your folders and select which groups (if any) you want to share them with.

Understanding Roles

Accounts

- Teacher
- Student
- Parent

Teachers can create and join groups, while students only have the ability to join groups. Parents do not actually sign up - they use an individualized code that connects to them directly to their child.

Co-Teaching

A teacher can give another teacher co-teacher access. With co-teacher access, the other teacher can help grade assignments, monitor discussions, and manage members. Students cannot be given co-teacher access.

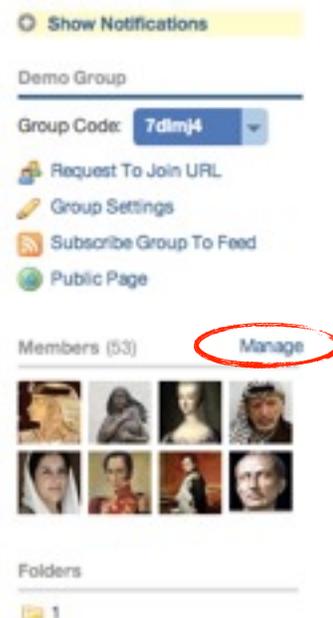
Read-Only Status

Teachers have the ability to place their group members in “read-only” status. This means that the group member can read posts within the group, but they cannot post messages to the entire group.

Small Groups

Teachers can also create small groups (or subgroups) within any of their groups.

Edit individual rights and privileges by using the MANAGE link on the right hand side of your group page.



Posting Resources

Teachers can post notes, alerts, assignments, quizzes, or polls.

For notes and assignments, you can attach files and links from your computer or Edmodo library. Any files or links you post will automatically be added to your library.

Grading Assignments

After you have given an assignment, you can see how many students have turned in that particular assignment, you will also receive an alert in your “Notifications” any time a student turns in an assignment.

By selecting a particular student’s name, you can review their assignments, provide feedback/comments, and mark grades within the assignment page. When a comment or grade is provided, students receive instant notification.
